PRESENTATION

During the course the decision-making criteria, useful to evaluate whether a compromised tooth could be recovered and maintained in healthy conditions in the oral cavity, will be presented. Prognostic evaluation will therefore be useful to determine whether the single dental element with uncertain prognosis, not only from the periodontal point of view, but also from conservative, endodontic and prosthetic ones, can be rationally recoverable or otherwise it should be considered as non-rational to put ongoing therapies for its recovery whose cost-benefit ratio is excessive. In case it is necessary to decide whether a dental element should be kept or extracted, a large number of diagnostic and prognostic factors have to be considered. It has often been proposed the possibility to attribute some prognostic scores to each dental element to determine whether to classify the tooth preservation as "possible", "uncertain" or "impossible" or as "convenient" (rational) or "not convenient" (irrational). Even though there are opinions from leading Researchers and Clinicians, it is important to consider that the number of variables that may be involved in these aspects (first of all the needs and the limitations coming from the patient) is so high to make subjective and questionable (because it is hardly to be investigated with quality research) every attempt to anchoring to scientific evidence the schematization of the prognostic path. Comparison between different professionals with different backgrounds will have to encourage and stimulate the discussion in order to undertake weighted therapeutic choices, rational and consistent with a medical practice attentive to the patient's interests.
